SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

First aid measures

Eye contact: Remove contact lenses, if wearing, and flush eyes with water for at least 15 minutes or until irritation subsides. If irritation persists, consult a physician.

Skin contact: Remove clothing and shoes, if contaminated. Wash skin with soap and water. Wash or clean contaminated clothing before reuse and discard oil-soaked shoes. If irritation persists, consult a physician.

SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

**Suitable extinguishing
media:** Extinguishing media include dry chemical, alcohol foam, and carbon dioxide. Do not use direct stream of water. Water may be used to keep fire-exposed containers cool.

**Unsuitable
extinguishing media:** Do not use direct stream of water.

Specific hazards: Pressure build-up due to heat exposure may cause containers to rupture. Use water spray to keep containers cool.

**Methods for
containment and
cleaning up** **Land spill:** Stop leak if you can do so without risk. Recover free product using non-sparking tools. Add sand, earth, or other suitable absorbent material to the spill area. Recover by pumping or with suitable absorbents. Dispose of in accordance with national and/or local regulations relating to waste disposal.

Water spill: Stop leak if you can do so without risk. Confine the spill immediately with booms. Remove from the surface by skimming or with suitable absorbents. Seek the advice of a specialist before using dispersants.

**Precautions for safe
handling:** Keep away from heat and direct sunlight. Ensure good ventilation/exhaustion at the workplace.

**Conditions for safe

incompatibilities:** Store in a cool, dry place in tightly sealed containers. Store out of direct sunlight. Do not store near heat, sparks, open flame, pilot lights, static electricity, or other sources of ignition. Do not store where temperature may exceed 49°C (120°F). Store away from oxidizing agents. Rotate stock.

Exposure controls
